

VET Student Loans

The VET Student Loan (VSL) program is an Australian Government assistance loan that helps eligible VET students, studying for a diploma qualification or higher, to pay their tuition fees. The Diploma In Aviation Courses offered by Fly Oz are eligible for these loans.

There are eligibility criteria including citizenship and residency requirements. Although a VET Student Loan (VSL) is a good initiative, there are certain aspects of the scheme that must be understood before going ahead with a government loan. The most important fact is that VET Student Loans attract a 20% fee, which is added to the course price. VSL is interest free.



Course Outline

This qualification is the minimum requirement for most charter and airline cadetship programs. Fly Oz Syllabus completes the entire training syllabus in a multi engine aircraft, so you will be job ready on completion.

Entry Requirements

- Class 1 Medical certificate
- Aviation English ICAO Level 6 or IELTS 6.0
- Aviation Security Identification Card (ASIC)
- Aviation Reference Number (ARN)
- Be at least 17 years of age.

Course Structure

This course is structured to ensure that students receive adequate training in AVI50519 Diploma of Aviation (Instrument Rating.) This includes 8 weeks of classroom and aircraft-based training of 27.5 hours per week face-to-face delivery.

The qualification is made up of 14 units of competency which consists of 13 core units and 1 elective unit all chosen by Fly Oz based in industry requirements.

Volume of Learning

The volume of learning allocated to a qualification will vary depending on the level of the qualification and the experience and competency of the student. As per the Australian Quality Framework, students must complete the allocated hours for the qualification they are undertaking in order to achieve competency. If the student applies for Recognition of Prior Learning or Credit Transfer, the volume of learning may be reduced.

Identification of Student Needs & Student Support

Student needs are declared by the applicant at the time of enrolment. The application form allows the applicant to self-declare where they have learning disabilities.

Fly Oz conducts a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment as part of the preenrolment aptitude testing. Reasonable adjustment to training and assessment will be made and additional support (e.g. LLN, assistive technology, additional training, alternative delivery and assessment modes and methods) provided where students with physical attributes or specific learning needs are identified as requiring these changes to complete their training and assessment.

Notes to the Tuition Schedule

This VET Course of study includes only units of competency from the Diploma of Aviation (Instrument Rating). As this course is approved under the Higher Education Support Act 2003, eligible students' tuition fees may be deferred under the VET Student Loans scheme.

It is a requirement that only those who meet the requirements below can access a VET Student Loans for this course.

Those requirements are that a person must:

- Unique Student Identifier USI application can be made at: www.usi.gov.au
- Class 1 Medical or proof of holding a Class 1 Medical prior without revocation The list of approved Designated Aviation Medical Examiners (DAMEs) is available at www.services.casa. gov.au/avmed/dame- search/
- At least a PPL(A) licence with current Flight Review

Please note that the above does not include the following incidental fees, which must be covered by the student:

- Tuition fees and flight costs for remedial training outside the approved syllabus (repeat flight lessons and ground training) required to achieve competency. These are charged at the current price list rates as published on the Fly Oz website.
- Any repeat attempt of any CASA exams required for your course. This includes repeating an exam that you fail to attend. These are charged at the current rates as detailed on the Aspeq website: https://aslau.aspeqexams.com/Home/TermsAndConditions/
- Any repeat attempt of any Flight tests required for your course. This includes both the cost of the flight sortie and the Testing officer's fees.
- Any additional textbooks you choose to purchase outside the issued textbooks or replacement books should you lose or misplace an issued text book.
- Uniform costs you will need to supply your own as per the Fly Oz dress code.
- Flight & booking cancellation fees these fees assist in covering the overhead costs if a student does not attend or complete a scheduled flight/booking as per the attendance and cancellation policy.
- The cost of gaining and maintaining your CASA Class 1 pilots medical.
- The cost of gaining and maintaining your ASIC security clearance card.



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
